



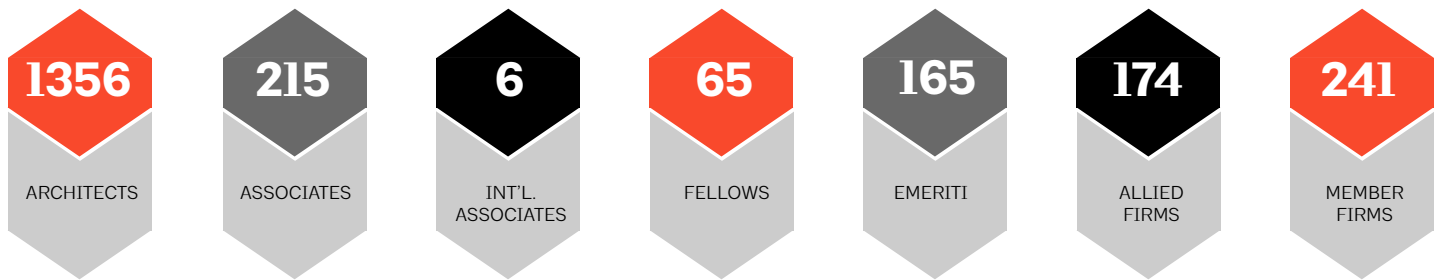

- AND DESIGN IN THE PUBLIC REALM**

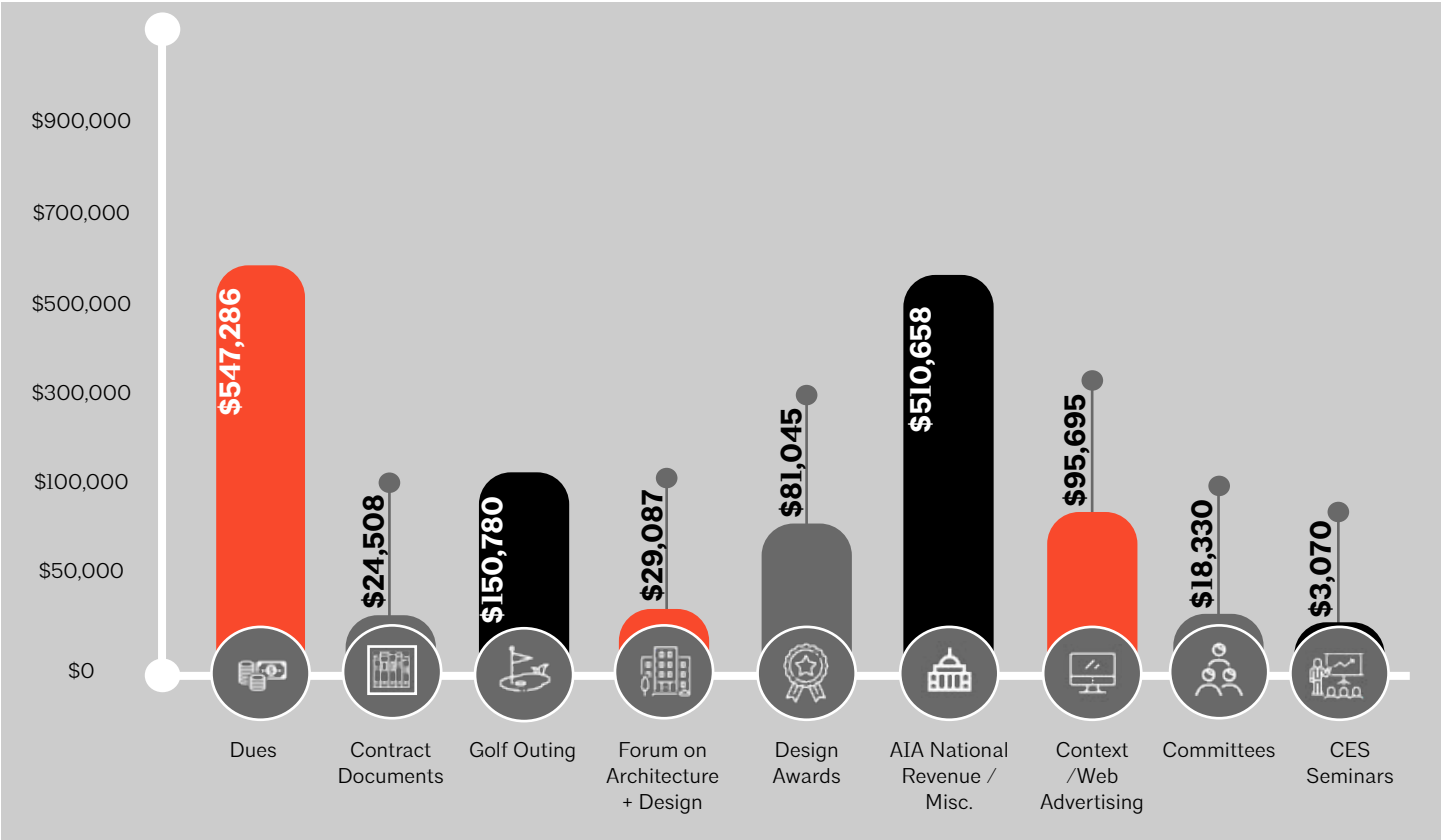
It was a great first step in building relationships with our city council members and sharing our priorities, while listening to them about what they are focused on.

SERVICE.

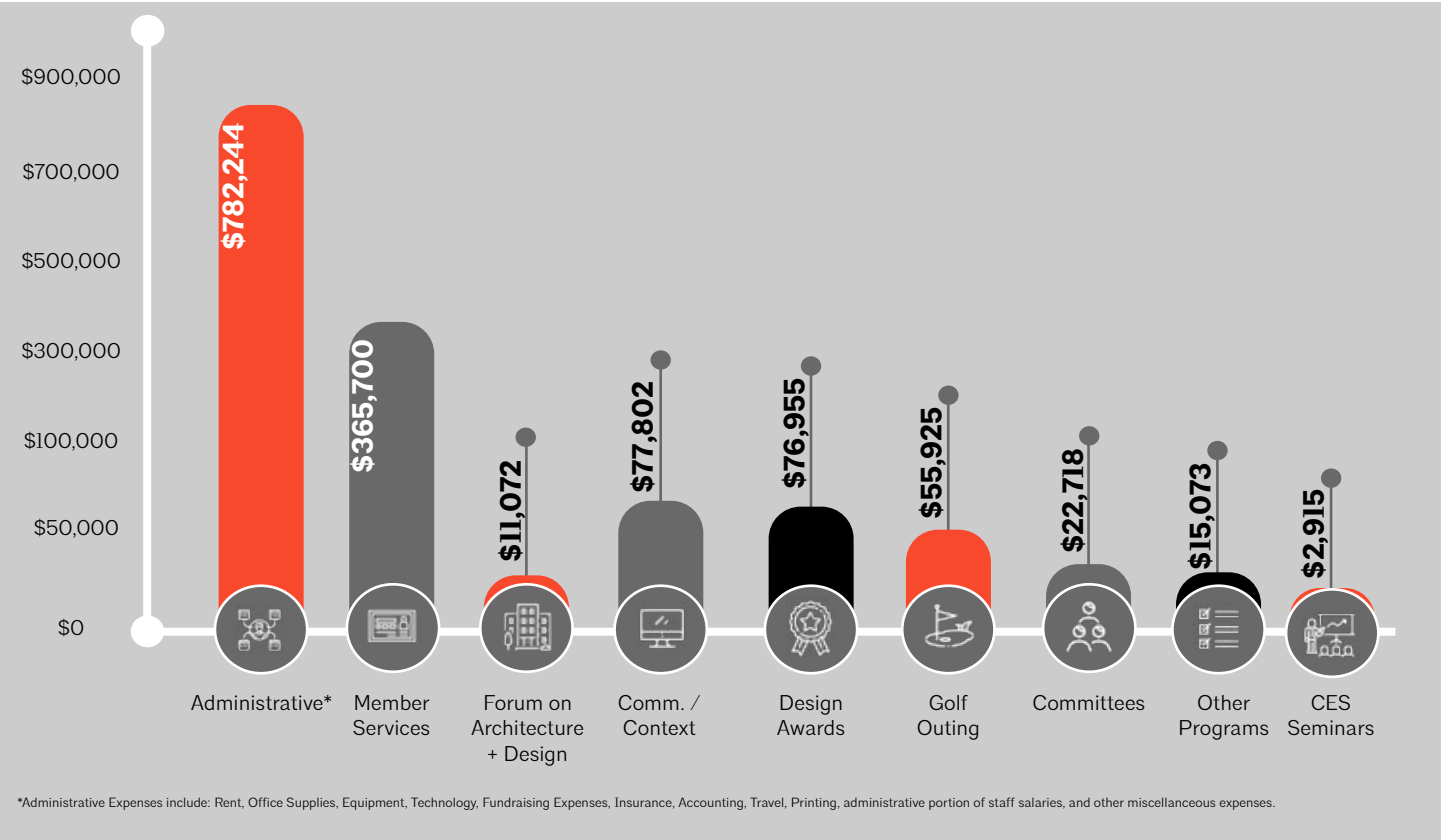

The Center hosted a talk by social psychiatrist and professor of urban policy and health at The New School, Mindy Thompson Fullilove, the 2021 recipient of the Edmund N. Bacon Urban Design Award. Dr. Fullilove was selected based on her focus on environmental justice, calling attention to the impacts industrial developments have on poor and minority communities.

2021 Michael Spain, Associate AIA, NOMA
Hired to lead Architecture in Design Education Program

The Center welcomed Michael Spain, Associate AIA, NOMA, as the new Director of Design Education. In this role, Michael is responsible for expanding and implementing the K-12 student design education programming throughout Philadelphia. The Center has a 40-year history of offering design education in various forms. Still, in the last three years, the organization's focus shifted to providing underserved youth in Philadelphia classrooms with access to design education. Michael's day to day activities include curriculum development, program design, volunteer outreach, donor cultivation, and stakeholder engagement. The position allows Michael to combine his experience as a designer with his passion for education and his commitment to strengthening the industry pipeline for black, Indigenous, and people of color.

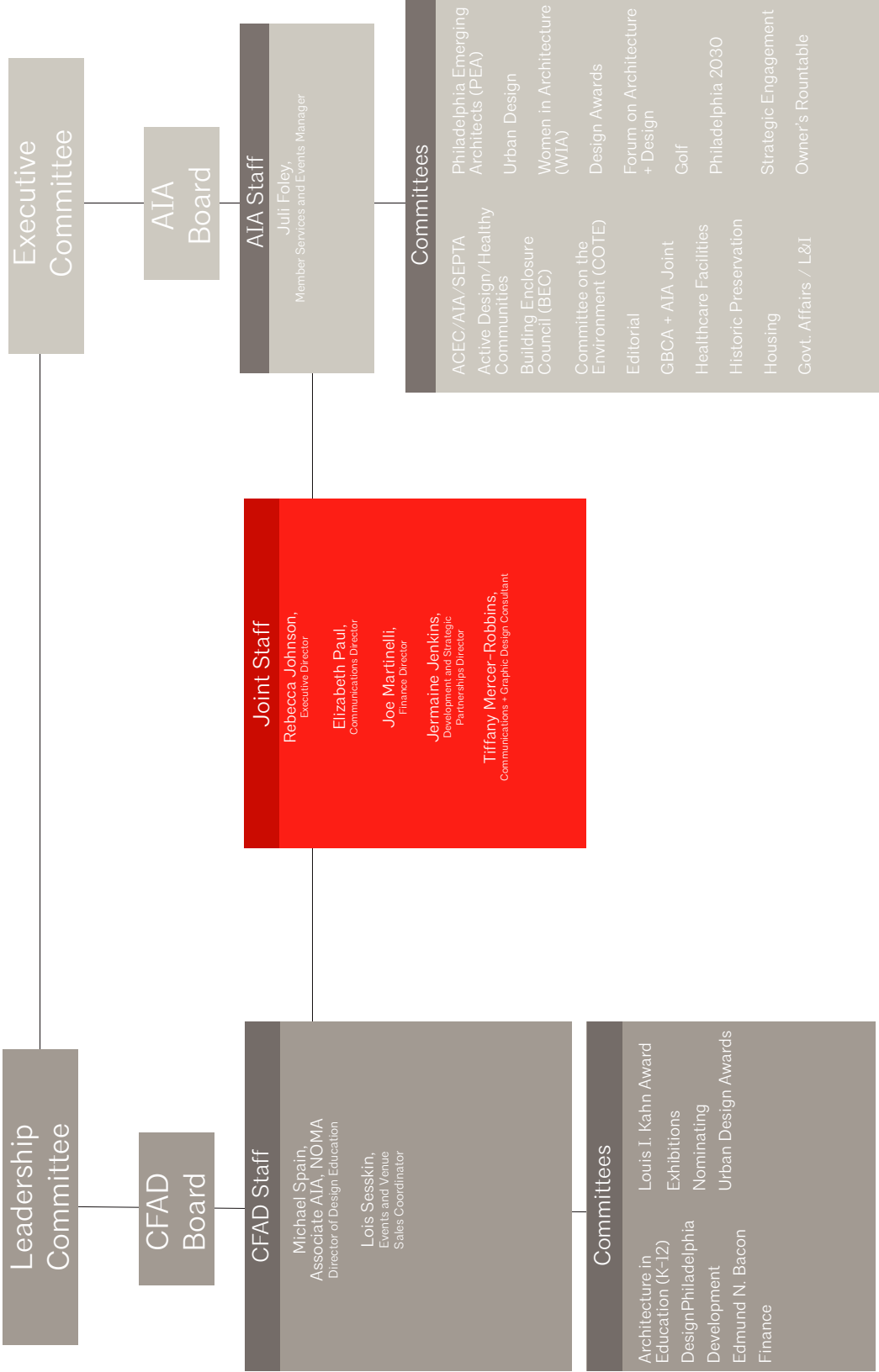

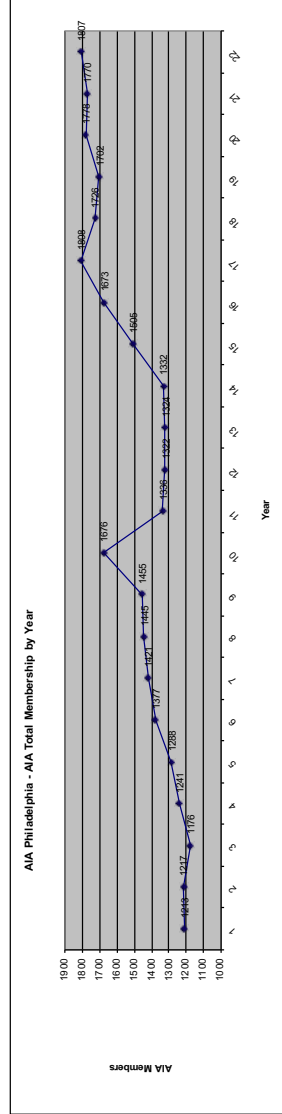
ORGANIZATION CHART

AIA Philadelphia Education Report

This report provides an overview of the educational offerings provided by AIA Philadelphia. Every year the Chapter presents continuing education programs on various topics including Practice Management, Urban Design, Preservation, Healthcare, Building Enclosure, Technology, Housing and more. In addition, the Chapter offers Architecture Registration Exam courses March through November. Architects, graduates, other design professional and non-members from Greater Philadelphia, Eastern Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland, and New York attend Chapter education programs and conferences.

Continuing Education

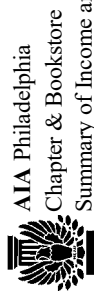
The numbers below reflect the continuing education courses for which AIA Philadelphia was the registered provider and programs presented by other AIA registered providers at AIA Philadelphia Chapter programs and events. These courses include programs organized by chapter staff, committees, architect, and affiliate member firms as well as numerous collaborating organizations including Associated Builders & Contractors, Urban Land Institute Philadelphia Chapter, American Planning Association Pennsylvania Chapter and the American Society of Landscape Architects Pennsylvania Delaware Chapter. Programs presented by other AIA registered providers are not included in these numbers even if those programs were presented at a Chapter committee meeting or event.

Architect Registration (ARE) Courses

AIA Philadelphia is the only Chapter in the region presenting ARE courses. Taught by volunteer instructors, these courses are provided to members and non-members at a significantly lower cost than ARE courses presented elsewhere. These courses, along with our ARE study guides lending library and the ARE Study Sessions organized by the Chapter's Young Architects Forum, provide a robust ARE preparation program for graduate architects in our region.
